

#### **Increased Electric Bills During Off-Season:**

**11/2014:** Due to a 300% increase in winter electrical bills, WVSC will implement an additional \$100 fee per member using a bubbler, and/or an additional \$100 fee for the use of space heaters in boats, during the winter. Notice will be sent to all members indicating that the \$100 fee will be assessed for electrical usage from January 1 – March 31, 2015.

Electrical usage has also increased in the summer, due to A/Cs used in boats. A \$100 fee will be accessed for boats using air conditioning, on the annual slip rental agreement.
