From the Commodore

Ahoy WVSC Sailors,

-February Meeting Minutes approved as written.

New Business:

Treasurer's Report: Paul Schye presented the Treasurer's Report. The Treasurer's report was accepted.

New member applications were received from Chuck and Kathy Radabaugh, and Tim and Sandy Smith. Motion to accept the two new membership applications. Motion passed. The Walnut Valley Sailing Club welcomes Chuck and Kathy Radabaug, and Tim and Sandy Smith. The Treasurer's report was accepted.

Committee Reports:

Finance Committee: Paul Schye reports the Finance Committee is working on the boat inventory for Butler County.

Racing Committee: No report.

Power Boat Committee: No report.

Building and Grounds Committee: No report.

Security Committee: Bill Fonger reports some work has been done on the security system. Bill asked if the Club might benefit from adding a fire alarm system. It was requested that Bill investigate the possibilities and report back.

Calling Committee: No report.

Long Range Planning Committee: No report.

Membership Committee: Ed Webb reports that the Club's booth at the Kansas Sport Boat and Travel Show February 16-19 was successful. Thirty nine people filled out request for information slips, with fourteen people specifically interested in the STEP learning to sail classes.

Mark Janzen reports that construction on the new website is coming along well. Mark presented a proposal

for a new membership application policy. The Board discussed the proposal and tabled the item for this meeting.

The Commodore requested that STEP boats be added to the section of the Handbook that lists the KA numbers of boats at the Club.

ADA Compliance Committee (Ad-Hoc): Commodore Bonifield presented a motion for a revised WVSC Boat Access Policy as follows:

WVSC BOAT ACCESS POLICY

WVSC will make certain STEP program boats and equipment available each year to any WVSC member who has either successfully completed an orientation session (which is offered to experienced sailors only) or one of the three week centerboard STEP classes. Kansas State Boating Regulation 32-1139 prohibits the use of STEP boats outside of the training program by persons under the age of seventeen. The boats currently available for use are Capri 14.2's.

These boats will be made available for the sailing season with exception of the period during the regularly scheduled classes.

A member may qualify to use these boats by completing either one of the three week centerboard classes or attending an orientation session conducted each spring. A member may be checked out in any of the boats or at other times by arranging an individual session with the STEP Program Manager or their designee. A \$40.00 fee will be charged for these individual sessions. Upon completion of one of the above, the member has access to the boats for the remainder of the sailing session. The centerboard class or orientation session is required each year before boats can be used.

Boats may be reserved by calling the Walnut Valley Sailing Club and reserving a boat for a specific time.

Anyone who: 1) comes under the ADA accessibility -act, 2) can successfully pass the class or orientation session, and 3) needs assistance in accessing, rigging or launching the boats may arrange for assistance at the time they make the reservation.

Motion passed and will be added to the Rules and Regulation as Section VIII.

2012 SUMMER ADULT SAILING PROGRAM

Come Sail With Us

The Walnut Valley Sailing Club/STEP program is offering two sessions this summer.

We will teach you how to sail or improve your sailing abilities. We offer both Basic Keelboat and Basic Centerboard classes. Advanced classes in Centerboard and Keelboat may also be available.

So come sail with us this summer for a GREAT time on the water. Our adult fleet consists of: Catalina 14.2's, Sonar, Catalina 22 and Catalina 25's.

CLASS STRUCTURE

Age Prerequisites: Must be 18 years or older, have an interest in learning to sail or improve your sailing abilities and swim 25 yards with a lifejacket (PFD). (May be 15-17 years old if accompanied by an adult).

Equipment requirements: Participants are required to provide their own life jacket (PFD) US Coast Guard approved age-appropriate size, sunscreen, hat and water shoes.

COURSE CONTENT

Basic Centerboard Sailing Course Covers beginning, intermediate and advanced sailing techniques in a centerboard boat including: boat handling skills, boat related skills, basic rules of the road, safety, weather and nomenclature. Everything you need to know to sail your own boat safely and with confidence.

Basic Keelboat Sailing Course

The keelboat course leads you through the essential principles of safe, confident day sailing. It covers basic sailing concepts, boat handling, docking, anchoring, safety and emergencies, weather and basic navigation. The keelboat course requires a minimum of three students per boat both in Basic and Advanced Keelboat.

Prerequisite for Advanced Centerboard or Keelboat instruction

You must have the Basic Sailing Course or equivalent sailing experience

Schedule: 3 days per week (Mon, Tues, Thurs.) for 3 weeks, 6 to 9pm, 2 sessions 1st session: June 11 through June 28 2nd session: July 9 through July 26

Class Size: 10 students per session
