THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 12TH, 2009

Call to Order: The Board of Governors meeting was called to order by David Reynolds, Commodore, 7:05 pm. Board members David Reynolds, Ernie Condon, John McCabe, Greg Rincker, Gary Mackey, Doug Johnson and Robert Brown were present. Debbie Chambers and Mike Wasson were absent.

John McCabe was introduced as the Board member who will complete the one year remaining on the term of John Ellison who resigned his membership.

Approval of October Meeting Minutes: A motion to approve the minutes of the October meeting was made and approved.

Treasurer's Report: Ernie Condon released the October Treasurer's Report, the 2009 Consolidated Income Statement and proposed 2010 budget. The ice machine line items that were on the 2010 budget released at the November 7th Annual meeting have been removed.

Election of Officers for 2010: A motion was made and seconded to elect Greg Rincker as the 2010 Commodore. Using the By-laws as the guide, discussion of Board positions and responsibilities followed. Motions were made and seconded to nominate Robert Brown as Vice Commodore, John McCabe as Treasurer and Ernie Condon as Secretary.

Call to Order: Commodore Reynolds called the annual meeting of WVSC to order at 7:10 pm.

Commodore Reynolds welcomed the general membership and, after thanking the membership for a very successful year, went on to review the meeting's agenda.

Approval of 2008 Annual Meeting Minutes:

A motion from the floor was made to approve the minutes as amended. The motion was seconded and by voice vote the membership approved the motion.

Treasurer's Report: Ernie Condon, Liaison to the Finance Committee, presented an ending financial status report for the year 2009. Ernie then presented the Consolidated Financial Statement for the sailing club and the STEP program for the year ending October 31st 2009. The budget for WVSC for 2010 was presented and explained. Ernie made a request of the membership for questions or comments. Gene Nold addressed the group and presented his concerns regarding the cost incurred by the club related to having an ice machine and ice available to the general membership on the north dock. He also felt the weight of the ice machine was putting undue stress on the dock. Commodore Reynolds and Debbie Chambers each made remarks related to the issue. A motion to reject the continuance of the ice machine was made and seconded. By voice vote the motion passed. A motion to accept the report for 2009 and proposed budget for 2010 was made. This motion was seconded and the membership approved the report by voice vote.

Election of Board of Governors: Vice Commodore Greg Rincker reported that a nominating committee had met and had selected three members for election to the board. The three members to be voted on for election to the Board of Governors for a period of three years – 2010-2012 are as follows: Robert Brown, Doug Johnson and Gary Mackey. Commodore Reynolds requested any additional nominations be offered from the floor. There being none, a motion to approve those members presented was made and on voice vote the Board members were elected.

New Business: Commodore Reynolds presented a request to change Article VIII of the by-laws pertaining to the duties of the Long Range Planning Committee. Since the by-law change was inadvertently omitted from the annual meeting package, it was not eligible for vote at this meeting.

Standing Committee Reports: Commodore Reynolds directed the membership to review the committee reports presented in the material handed out at the beginning of the meet-

ing. The Commodore then went thru the list of standing committees and gave the chairman of each committee an opportunity to expand on the report they had filed for the annual report. Gene Nold, Chairman of the Government Relations Committee, addressed the membership to advise that there were several changes in personnel being made at the various government offices that govern use of and activities allowed at the lake. Debbie Chambers, Chairman of the Social Committee, thanked all those that had helped with any of the socials given this past year. Also plans for the upcoming Christmas party were presented and the membership was encouraged to attend. No other remarks by chairmen were presented.

Presentation of Awards: Commodore Reynolds thanked the membership for the support that he had received throughout the past year and encouraged all members to volunteer time to the club. He then turned the meeting over to the Chairman of the Racing Committee for the presentation of awards. Dan Barlett presented a number of awards to members that participated in racing activities this past season. Then, Genee Kubin, representing the Awards Committee, presented Commodore Reynolds with a plaque thanking him for his service to the club as Commodore. Next an award for sportsmanship was presented to Ken Rix, who has been involved in racing activities for many years. Genee related that this past year a group of members, who often spend Saturday night at the lake, have begun having a Sunday breakfast buffet. Those participating provide whatever food items that they have and those members that are doing the cooking that week fix the food. An award for extraordinary cooking services was made to Charlie Volk. Charlie was not at the meeting but a Pirates cookbook will be presented to him later by the Awards Chairperson. Finally, continuing in the vein, an award for being the youngest and the most helpful sail club member was presented to Taylor Barlett. Her father accepted the award on her behalf.

In conclusion, Genee advised the group that the awards committee had selected John Carter for the Bosun's Mess award. This award was given to John Carter for his years of service to WVSC.

Adjournment: There being no further business, a motion for adjournment was made, seconded and the meeting was adjourned.
