eady! Set! Sail! The recent set of emails regarding the Club activities is a clear indication that the sailing season is here. The water has been turned on, the Clubhouse has been cleaned and weekend races are underway so the activities are starting. There are a lot of folks that have spent time planning and organizing their committees so that the rest of us can enjoy the facility and sailing. In the past, I have written about our budget concerns. We may gain a few new members into the summer but our numbers are essentially set for the year. Based on the budget that was approved at the 2009 Annual Meeting and our receipts to date, we are on solid ground. The 2010 budget was conservative enough that the BOG has decided that we do not need to change Committee line items for this year with the exception of one entry for the Club House. The Board is getting estimates for the shelter expansion which was approved for 2010, and it appears that we will be able to proceed with that project.

Please review the Board of Governors meeting minutes. The Kansas Dept. of Wildlife and Parks has grant money and has made a proposal to WVSC to establish "water trails" at El Dorado Lake. This proposal would be unique and would have some real benefits for the Club, but a contribution, mostly from volunteer labor, would be required. Rob Brown is the Board contact for this proposal. We are soliciting your comments and feedback on this concept.

2010 SUMMER ADULT SAILING PROGRAM

The Walnut Valley Sailing Club/STEP program is offering two sessions this summer.

We will teach you how to sail in a centerboard boat or a keelboat. We will improve your sailing ability in advanced classes. We also offer Basic Keelboat classes.

So come sail with us this summer for a GREAT time on the water.

Our adult fleet consists of — Catalina 14.2's, Sonar, Catalina 22 and Catalina 25's.

CLASS STRUCTURE

Age Prerequisites: Must be 18 years or older, have an interest in learning to sail and swim 25 yards without a lifejacket (PFD). (May be 15-17 years old if accompanied by an adult).

Equipment requirements: Participants are required to provide their own life jacket (PFD) US Coast Guard approved, age-appropriate size and sunscreen, hat and water shoes.

COURSE CONTENT:

Basic Sailing Course - Covers beginning, intermediate and advanced sailing techniques. Boat handling skills, boat related skills, basic rules of the road, safety, weather and nomenclature. Everything you need to know to sail your own boat safely and with confidence.

Basic Keelboat - The keelboat course leads you through the essential principles of safe, confident day sailing. It covers basic sailing concepts, boat handling, docking, anchoring, safety and emergencies, weather, basic navigation. The keelboat course requires a minimum of three students per boat.

Prerequisite for Basic Keelboat instruction - you must have the Basic Sailing Course or equivalent sailing experience.

Schedule: 3 days per week (Mon. Tues. Thurs.) for 3 weeks, 6 to 9pm. 2 Sessions:

- 1st session: June 14 through July 1
- 2nd session: July 5 through July 22

Class Size: 10 students per session

Cost per Student: WVSC members-\$25 non-refundable Registration Fee, Plus \$155 class fee, total cost-\$180; Non-members-\$25 non-refundable registration fee Plus \$155 for class fee and \$100 for 1/2 annual WVSC club dues Total cost- \$280. (accompanying Spouse or family member \$180)

Fee Includes: USSA "Start Sailing Right" or "Basic Keelboat" instruction manual, instruction, use of a Catalina 14.2 (if checked out) boat for the summer, T-shirt and certificate. Includes a membership to Walnut Valley Sailing Club, which begins at the beginning of class and continues for the remainder of the year.

Club members present: Paul Schye, Gene Plehal, Gene Nold and Gary Pierce.

- 1. Call to order opening remarks
 - a. Quorum yes.
- 2. Corrections to Minutes of March 2010 Board meeting? None – approved as written.
- 3. Treasurer's Report March 2010
 - a. Financial summary/projection to the end of the fiscal year Minutes:

New member application: New member Brad Oblak was approved.

Two key items: Budget and potential revenues.

Potential revenues: Many slips are left un-leased. This is a strong opportunity for increased revenue.

Budget: Collected revenues are higher than projected in the approved 2010 budget, and total expenses so far are under budget. No special reason at this time to re-budget – approved 2010 budget stands as approved.

Storage Unit: The \$900 allocated in the Activity Center budget for a storage unit for tables and chairs has been removed because it was deemed not practical. This frees up \$900 for other uses. The board's decision is to change the Activity Center budget from \$6000 to \$5100. All other items budgeted for the Activity Center stand as budgeted including refinishing the floor, refinishing the ceiling, repairing the chairs, repair or replace screen doors.

A retractable awning: This item was approved in 2008 but was never funded. Motion was made that this is not a practical project and should be removed from the projects list. Motion approved.

Shelter expansion: Get details on cost estimates to proceed with project. Paul McCausland is to follow up with a plan.

Picnic tables purchase: This item is listed and approved as 'other' in the 2010 budget and can be pursued upon completion of shelter expansion.

4. Old Business

a. STEP equipment buildings - update

Minutes: Two papers provided were by Gene Nold. One is the ADA paper that was discussed with Kansas department of Wildlife and Parks (KDWP) and the other is a storage unit status.

ADA: Once the storage unit is set in place, KDWP will make the determination if a ramp is needed for ADA accessibility. WVSC/STEP will readily comply with the decision. KDWP will supply the materials if so requested by WVSC/STEP.

Storage unit status: The storage unit has been moved to the new location. Aesthetic improvements are yet to come. New development: KDWP has volunteered to provide the siding for the storage unit, and will provide the labor to install it, if we so choose. Siding will match the existing clubhouse and storage unit. A pitched roof is not included at this time, but if at the end of the year a pitched roof is needed, the KDWP will look into helping with this as well. The building is a temporary unit, and a review will be made at the end of the season.

- b. Committees Liaisons and Chair positions and reports Annual meeting is scheduled at House of Schwann for Nov 13. Contract will be provided to Treasurer.
 - A proposal was received from a member to do the mowing for less than we have been paying. This proposal will be considered by the committee.
- c. Vandalism/Thefts incident of May 2009 status (Reynolds) No new news
- d. Delinquent members update (Condon/McCabe) All revenues received or accounts closed.
- e. Abandoned boats update(Condon) No update
- f. Insurance update McCabe/Schye Insurance paid – we are insured through Andy Woodward Insurance. The premium came in \$1750 below budget. Our thanks goes to Paul Schye for his efforts.
- g. ADA complaint follow-up Status provided. As described above, KDWP will review the need for a ramp once the storage unit is in place, and WVSC will comply with the decision. No other action is/will be required.

5. New Business

first aid kit.

a. Opportunity with the State of Kansas There was a proposal made by KDWP to pursue a grant to make "water trails" for public use. Other states have done this, but it would be a first for Kansas. If WVSC were to help with the establishing of water trails, this grant could potentially fund 80% of a floating storage unit for WVSC/STEP use to replace the temporary unit. To have a chance at this, the proposal would need to be submitted by August this year, would then be reviewed by October, and WVSC notified in January (2011). Hypothetical sketches for such a facility were provided by STEP in this meeting. The building would NOT be open to the public, though the trails would. The 20% contribution from WVSC could include volunteer labor in lieu of cash. Board direction is to prepare a concept and overview, provide it to the membership via email and newsletter for comments and to see if someone would like to help.....this is to be a WVSC project, not a STEP project: action for Long Range Planning (Robert Brown Chair) to provide the summary/concept/outline. Final full go-ahead will be decided later. This would be a small boat facility for the club and need to be managed as such.
