### **New Business:**


 Commodore requests any anticipated unusual budget needs for next year be provided to the Treasurer by Board Liaisons from Committee Chairmen prior to the next Board meeting



### POTATO CASSEROLE

\*From August Fish Fry

2 pounds frozen hash browns, thawed

16 oz. French onion dip

6 Tablespoons margarine, melted

8 ounces cheddar cheese-shredded

1 can cream of chicken soup

1 crushed stovetop stuffing mix

4 Tablespoons margarine, melted



Preheat oven to 350°. Spray a 9 x 13 pan with non-stick cooking spray. Mix hash browns, French onion dip, 6 T. of butter, chicken soup and cheese together and pour into casserole dish. Top with crushed Stovetop and dot with 4 T. butter or margarine. (Dave and I just crush the Stovetop stuffing with our hands while it is still in the plastic bag.) I try to find the Stovetop stuffing in the canister which is already crushed, but both kinds will work.

Bake 1 hour. Put foil over the casserole for the first 20 minutes, to prevent the stuffing from get too brown.

If you wrap the potato casseroles in a towel and put them into an ice chest, they should stay warm until ready to eat. This casserole was designed to serve either hot or at room temperature. It can be warmed up, if needed, right before serving.
