
particular grilling choice for their steaks

The Walnut Valley Sailing Club/STEP program is offering two youth and adult sailing programs this summer. So get your buddy that would like to sail with you and join us this summer for a fun time on the water.

Youth Class Structure

- **Prerequisites:** Must be 7-17, have an interest in sailing, and swim 25 yards without a life jacket (PFD) (swimming will be tested).
- Equipment Requirements: Participants are required to provide their own life jacket (PFD) US Coast Guard approved, and age-appropriate size), sunscreen, hat, and water shoes.
- Course Content: safety, swimming, weather, self rescue skills, basic rules of the road, courtesy, and nomenclature. Beginners, Intermediate and Advanced sailing offered.
- **Schedule:** 3 days per week (Mon. Tues. Thurs) for 3 weeks, 10am to 4pm.

2 sessions:


- 1st session June 30 through July17
- 2nd session July 21 through August 7
- Cost per Student: \$25 non-refundable Registration Fee, \$45 Class Fee for member, \$70 for non-member.
- Fee Includes: USSA "Start Sailing Right" instruction manual, use of a boat for the summer, T-shirt and awards. For participants age 16 and over, the fee also includes a Junior Membership to Walnut Valley Sailing Club that begins at the beginning of class and continues for the remainder of the year, if not a member. For participants between the ages of 7 and 15, the fee also includes a Youth Membership to Walnut Valley Sailing Club which begins at the beginning of class and continues for the remainder of the year, if not a member. Drinks are furnished. Student brings lunch.
- Class Size: 20 students per session.
- Boats: Capri 14.2, JY Trainers, Sabots, Sunfish

Adult Class Structure

- **Prerequisites:** must be 18 years or older, have an interest in sailing, and swim 25 yards without a life jacket(PFD). (may be 15-17 years old if accompanied by an adult)
- Equipment Requirements: Participants are required to provide their own life jacket (PFD) (US Coast Guard approved, and age-appropriate size), sunscreen hat, and water shoes.
- Course Content: Safety, weather, man-overboard skills, boat related skills, boat handling skills, basic rules of the road, and nomenclature. Beginner, intermediate and advanced centerboard and keelboat offered.
- **Schedule:** 3 days per week (Mon. Tues. Thurs.) for 3 weeks, 6 to 9pm

2 sessions:

- 1st session June 30 through July 18
- 2nd session: July 21 through August 8
- Class Size: 10 students per session
- Cost per Student: \$25 non-refundable Registration Fee, \$55 Class Fee for members, \$255 for non-member (Spouse \$80).
- Fee Includes: USSA "Start Sailing Right " instruction manual, instruction, membership to Walnut Valley Sailing Club which begins at the beginning of class and continues for the remainder of the year, if not a member, and use of the training boats for the summer.
- Boats: Capri 14.2, keelboats, Sunfish





Board Meeting Minutes

WALNUT VALLEY SAILING CLUB May Meeting of the Board of Governors

Thursday, May 9th, 2003

CALL TO ORDER: Commodore Bruce Ward called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. at Kroupa's office. Board members present were Marilyn Kroupa, Preston Brammer, James Rix, Eric Wertheimer, Bruce Ward, Charlie Volk and Janis Cooper. Committee Chair Tom Burgin and members Mike Hand, Mark and Holly Gage and Alice Ward were also present.

MINUTES: Minutes from the April meeting were approved as read. Rix/Brammer

TREASURER'S REPORT: Bruce Ward presented Steve Warfield's Treasurer's report. He noted that the Club boat cover cost had increased to \$800.00 and that Steve recommended that the cap for borrowing on the dock improvements be set at \$15,000. The report was accepted. Volk/Wertheimer

Membership: Bruce reported that we have one new application for membership. The new member is Michael Wasson with a Chrysler 22. A motion was made to accept the Wasson family as new members. Motion passed .Cooper/Volk

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Insurance: Dick Zietler, Don Chism and Wayne Hemmen have been appointed as the committee to reevaluate the Club's capitol improvements for insurance purposes.

Membership: The 2003 Handbook is completed and has been distributed to the membership.

Work Credits: Charlie Volk stated that the work credits value has been miss-stated in the hand book. Bruce will follow up on the correction.

Building and Grounds: Preston Brammer reported that State of Kansas wants half of our picnic tables back and will return them on a single use basis if notified one week in advance. Fire extinguishers will be inspected annually. We are still looking for a way to get rid of the Styrofoam and BFI will be contacted to see if they will remove it.

Harbor: Charlie Volk reported that Gary Pierce has repaired the dinghy dock pipes. Bruce stated that he



was still working on the contract with the Company that will build our new dock improvements.

Social: May 10th there will be the Men's Cook Off and the dedication of the activity building.

Sailing Activities: Tom Burgin stated that there are openings for people to work on the Sailing Activities Committee.

OLD BUSINESS:

Dock Box: The Commodore will send a letter on behalf of the Board telling the owner of the non-compliant dock box that the Club will remove the dock box and store it in an area to be determined at a later time.

STEP Program: Butch Stringer donated his boat to the STEP program last Monday and the STEP Program intends to sell the boat.

The WVSC Racing Community held a Box Supper Auction April 26th and raised \$2,300 for the STEP Program.

Since the STEP program is a tax exempt program Bruce Ward reported from the STEP Program that the boats may not be used for recreational purposes and may be used only for safety and educational purposes.

A motion was made that the STEP Program will be encouraged by the WVSC Board to keep only that amount of cash STEP needs to carry out the program and any cash in excess of that amount be used to pay back their debt to WVSC. Motion passed. /Rix

MEMBER CONCERNS:

At this point in the meeting Bruce recused himself and turned the meeting over to the Vice Commodore, James Rix, because of his conflict of interest concerning the next topic of discussion. Alice Ward presented her objections to the Board's policy regarding hydro hoists. She stated that, in her opinion, currently hydro hoists are approved for installation without any overall plan, without consideration of the docks and without consideration of adjoining slip owners and that she objected to the installation of Tom Burgin's hoist on slip #28. She suggested that the Club should designate hoists to a cer-
