Be ready to bombard the pirates while their ships lay at anchor on El Dorado Lake.


Ye must gather all the clues from the pirates on the water and then afterwards meet at the docks for ye final clues.

Hello everyone! My name is Fred Harvey and not too long ago I took over from Bruce Ward as the webmaster for the club's web site. Bruce did a great job and as a result he has set the bar pretty high for me. Still I am going to attempt to leap over it in a single bound, although I probably will have to back up and get a running start in order to do it.

I am a great believer in not fixing something if it is not broken. As a consequence, I have made only minor changes to the appearance of the web site. One thing I have done is to post the upcoming club events on the site's home page. I have included links from each of these ads that will bring up the flyer for that event. These

events are also posted under the "Master Calendar" option that is on the main menu.

If you want to sell an item, the "For Sale/Wanted" section of the site offers you an easy way to let other sailors know about the items you no longer need. Currently, we do not have any Wanted items, but if there is something that you are looking for just let me know and I will add it to the listing.

Many members may not know that our web site also has a restricted area that is available to members only. I took this section down for a couple of weeks while I updated some of the files in there. The Members Only area contains pictures of past social events and sailing activities. There are also current maps of the Dry Storage Area and the Dock Slips, plus an electronic copy of the 2008 membership handbook available for downloading.

Club members must register in order to access the Members Only area. When I reviewed the authorized users,

I found that some people hadn't been in this area for three years. If you combine this with the fact that a name like Sailorman@Yahoo.com doesn't tell me if that person is still a member or not, and I think you can see the problem I had. To fix the problem, I deleted all of the users who have not gotten into the Members Only section during this calendar year.

If you have not been into the Members Only section before or have forgotten how, there is the word Login at the top of each of the public pages. If you are a registered user you can click on that link, then enter your user name & password for access to the Members Only Sections. Once you do log in the only thing that will change is that Members Only will appear at the bottom of the main menu selections. In the Members Only area you can review data about the club plus look at all of the embarrassing photos from past social functions.

If you have never registered, or registered some time ago, you will need to re-register. To do this, click on the word Register which is also at the top of each page. When you do you will see the following form. Please fill it out with your own information similar to

this example:

When you have the information entered, click the REGISTER button. THEN, send an e-mail to your friendly webmaster at frayedharley-wvsc@yahoo.com telling me that you have registered. I will change the status of your name so that you will have access to the Members Only Section.

If you should forget your password, there is no way for me to get it for you. The system hides passwords from me too. If you should forget the password, let me know. I will delete you as a user and then you can register again.

The club's web site is

an important part of the club's Public Affairs department. The Internet and E-mail are how people do business today. The Net is the first place most people go when they want to research a topic or find an organization such as ours. It's that good first impression that we want to make with people. As such, I am open to any and all suggestions that the members have about what they want added, removed or changed. I'm only as far away as your e-mail account, so please, give me feed back!



Board Meeting Minutes

WALNUT VALLEY SAILING CLUB BOARD OF GOVERNORS MEETING

Minutes Subject to Correction

THURSDAY, JULY 10th, 2008

Call to Order Commodore Carter called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM at the office of Steve Mardis, 9415 East Harry, Suite 603, Wichita, KS. Board members present were David Reynolds, Kathy Malcom, John Carter, Ken Rix, John Ellison, and Ernie Condon.

Opening Remarks Commodore Carter noted the great turnout for the Shrimp Boil. He also commented on the success of Scrabble Sail with seven skippers and crew competing for prizes. There were five boats that sailed to the 4th of July fireworks display across the lake. The Long Distance Fun Race on July 5th was a big success with eight boats competing. The STEP program classes are progressing with the possibility of new club memberships. The lake level on July 10th was 1339.43 feet, slightly above pool.

Approval of the June, 2008 Board Meeting Minutes

Minutes of the June 12, 2008 meeting were reviewed and submitted for discussion. One correction was made in the New Business section regarding the meals for social activity support staff. The last line was corrected to read "...After a lengthy discussion, a motion to provide the sponsor and their crew a meal for no charge or work credit hours (at the option of the Social Committee Chair) was approved by a majority of one vote..." A motion was made to approve the minutes as corrected. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report Ernie Condon reported that we have 107 regular members; there were no resignations. The membership application of David and Lisa Dodson and family was approved pending payment of all dues and fees required for regular membership. Ernie was to check on the increase in the cost of mowing the grass at the club before approval of the next payment. Ernie plans to add an itemization of "other income" to the details in the monthly report, and will continue to work on the income/cost details of each party or social function for future reference.

Committee Reports

Buildings & Grounds – Kathy Malcom is planning a "paint the picnic tables" work party for August 2nd, with notification sent to club members. She also plans a small clean-up party for Friday, July 11th, to remove flood debris from the parking lot. She is also working on getting a bid for the upgrade of the electrical wiring of the picnic shelter to prevent future damage from the flooding of the lake.

Harbor – Jerry Brady (by written report) plans a work party for July 19th to replace more dock boards. A notice is in the July newsletter. The dock lights have been replaced with fluorescent bulbs to save energy and prolong bulb life. The new safety/swim ladders will be installed in July.

Old Business

Activities Center – Plans for continued improvements will be tabled until the July Board meeting.

New Business.

Activities Center – Housekeeping. As reported earlier, we do not have a contract for a cleaner (housekeeper) on a regular basis. No one has offered to fill this role from the ad in the newsletter. Several members have been cleaning as necessary and members are asked to clean up after each use for the benefit of all members. David Reynolds offered to look into cleaning the clubhouse for the remainder of this season to establish a benchmark for time, effort, and cost needed to maintain minimum cleanliness with the support of all members. He will contact Debbie Chambers to discuss details soon.

Member Concerns Commodore John Carter presented a member concern that we may be starting a trend to schedule more activities on Sundays that might interfere with members' options for church attendance. After some discussion, it was noted that we have had club races alternate between Saturdays and Sundays for several years to accommodate both Saturday "work" and Sunday "work/church" activities. This arrangement has not presented a problem for our members, to the knowledge of this Board. Occasional Sunday activities are, and have been, scheduled to work around a holiday weekend or other activities. However, it was noted that the Board and the Social Committee have been, and are currently, sensitive to activities planned for Sundays and holidays in light of members' options for church and similar commitments.

The Commodore presented a request from Jerry Brady and family to permit their use of the picnic shelter (with restroom access) for an outing for the Andover United Methodist Church senior youth group on Sunday, July 20, 2008. Discussion was held. Ken Rix said it would not conflict with the already scheduled Snipe Regatta, since they should be finished about 1:00 PM. Motion was made and approved to allow this use.

Closing Remarks The Commodore reminded those present of the upcoming events, including the Hawaiian Luau on July 19th; the Regional Snipe Regatta on July 19-20; and the Cooper's Island Theatre on Friday, July 25th.

The next board meeting will be held on Thursday, August 14, 2008, at 7:00 PM at the office of Steve Mardis, 9415 East Harry, Suite 603, Wichita, KS.

Adjournment Having no further business, Ken Rix motioned to adjourn. John Ellison seconded. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 8:10 PM.
