The Social Committee has been busy planning and getting organized for our club parties. In addition, the Sailing Activities Committee has made plans for an exciting slate of events. The Board approved the idea that each trailer in dry storage would be identified with a tag indicating the owner's name, in accordance with WVSC's rules. These tags will be attached to the trailers this spring by the Dry Storage Committee.

- There will be some races of 14.2 boats on some Wednesday evenings starting in mid June or early July. Details will come later in the Windword.
- The Club Championship procedure this year will give points equal to 26 minus the finish place & then squared, for each race. These points are then averaged thru the year by the number of races that skipper participated in, & then adding 5 points per race to get an accumulative score. This system places more emphasis on participation than systems we have used in the past.

Race finishes, averages, bonuses, total scores, & rankings, will be posted regularly at the lake & in the Windward, so racers can see who they need to beat. Trophies will be awarded at the Annual meeting for at least 3 keel & 3 centerboard boats.
- A classroom training session is scheduled for March 30th at the Pizza Hut, 307 N. Andover Road, Andover at 2:00 P.M. Please plan on being there. We will have a discussion of whatever the participants want. Semi-professionals will be prepared to talk about: Racing rules, Starting sequences, Sailing instructions, Portsmouth ratings, Race committee responsibilities, Cute chicks, & Tactics.
- An “on the water” training session will be conducted on Saturday, April 12. A blow out day would be Saturday April 19. Semi-professionals will be prepared to talk about: Sail trim, Rigging, Crew responsibilities, Boat repair, Cute chicks, & Tactics.
- Volunteers signed up for daily regatta responsibilities, but there are lots of good openings still available. Please call Ken Rix 684-6086, or e-mail at: sail4it@att.net with your preferences. Your cooperation is appreciated & it’s a good opportunity to get your feet wet. Attached somewhere in this newsletter is a current listing.
- The unofficial, uncoordinated, day when any sailor- racer or cruiser- can get help in launching his/her boat is set for Saturday April 12. If there is a blizzard, high wind, sleet or snow, just stay home & watch the mailman, cause he’s supposed to work in those conditions. Then come out the next Saturday April 19 for the unofficial, uncoordinated launch day. Your boat will then be ready for the Gala Opening Race of the Season April 20th.

We will teach you how to sail in a beginner's class or improve your sailing ability in advanced classes. We are offering Keelboat classes to advanced sailors.


So come sail with us or better yet, get your buddy that would like to sail with you and join us this summer for a GREAT time on the water.

Our fleet consists of: Prams, Sabots, Optimists, Catalina 14.2's, Sunfish, Lasers, Sonar, Catalina 22 and Catalina 25's.

### CLASS STRUCTURE

**Age Prerequisites:** Must be 8-17, have an interest in learning to sail and swim 25 yards without a lifejacket (PFD) (swimming will be tested).

**Equipment requirements:** Participants are required to provide their own life jacket (PFD) US Coast Guard approved, age-appropriate size and sunscreen, hat and water shoes.



**Course Content:** Three levels of sailing instruction, beginners, intermediate and advanced sailing offered. Safety, weather, self-rescuing skills, basic rules of the road and nomenclature are also covered.

**Schedule:** 3 days per week (Mon, Tues, and Thurs) for 3 weeks 10am to 4pm, 2 sessions:

- 1st session: June 16 through July 3
- 2nd session: July 7 through July 24

**Cost per Student:** \$25 non-refundable Registration Fee, Plus \$45 class fee for WVSC members; \$70 for non-members.

**Fee Includes:** USSA "Start Sailing Right" or "Basic Keelboat" instruction manual, use of a boat for the summer, T-shirt and awards. For participants between the ages of 8 and 17, the fee also includes a Youth Membership to Walnut Valley Sailing Club which begins at the beginning of class and continues for the remainder of the year. For participants age 16 and over, the fee includes a Junior Membership to Walnut Valley Sailing Club that begins at the beginning of class and continues for the remainder of the year.

Drinks are furnished. Student brings lunch.

**Class Size:** 20 students per session. Prerequisite for Keelboat instruction- proof of advanced sailing abilities. A minimum of three students are required for the Keelboat class to be held.

## 2008 SUMMER ADULT SAILING PROGRAM

The Walnut Valley Sailing Club/STEP program is offering two sessions this summer.

We will teach you how to sail in a Catalina 14.2 centerboard boat or improve your sailing ability in advanced classes. We also offer Basic Keelboat classes.

So come sail with us this summer for a GREAT time on the water.

Our adult fleet consists of — Catalina 14.2's, Sonar, Catalina 22 and Catalina 25's.

### CLASS STRUCTURE

**Age Prerequisites:** Must be 18 years or older, have an interest in learning to sail and swim 25 yards without a lifejacket (PFD). (May be 15-17 years old if accompanied by an adult).

**Equipment requirements:** Participants are required to provide their own life jacket (PFD) US Coast Guard approved, age-appropriate size and sunscreen, hat and water shoes.

**Course Content:** Basic Sailing Course- Covers beginning, intermediate and advanced sailing techniques. Boat handling skills, boat related skills, basic rules of the road, safety, weather and nomenclature. Everything you need to know to sail your own boat safely and with confidence.

**Basic Keelboat** - The keelboat course leads you through the essential principles of safe, confident day sailing. It covers basic sailing concepts, boat handling, docking, anchoring, safety and emergencies, weather, basic navigation. The keelboat course requires a minimum of three students per boat.

**Prerequisite for Basic Keelboat instruction** - you must have the Basic Sailing Course or equivalent sailing experience.

**Schedule:** 3 days per week (Mon. Tues. Thurs.) for 3 weeks, 6 to 9pm. 2 Sessions:

- 1st session: June 16 through July 3
- 2nd session: July 7 through July 24

**Class Size:** 10 students per session

# Board Meeting Minutes

WALNUT VALLEY SAILING CLUB BOARD OF GOVERNORS MEETING

*Minutes Subject to Correction*

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 2008

**February Meeting Minutes:** The meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM. The following Board members attended: John Carter, Ken Rix, Steve Mardis, Ernie Condon, Debbie Chambers, Kathy Malcom, John Ellison and Jerry Brady. Visitors attending included Clark Chambers. The minutes of the January meeting were approved as read.

**Treasurer's Report:** Ernie Condon presented the Treasurer's Report. A motion to approve was made, seconded and approved.

## Committee Reports:

**STEP program:** Gene Nold presented information on the Step Program for 2008. The scheduled classes for this summer program are June 16th to July 3rd and July 7th to July 24th. Gene advised that a change in the fee structure was needed and requested approval from the board. A motion to approve the change in fees was made, seconded and approved.

**Activities Center:** Debbie Chambers, as the liaison for the Activities Center, presented information on a number of options for improving and updating the Activities Center. Commodore Carter asked all board members to review the information and prioritize the recommended projects, then e-mail their prioritized lists to him by March 1st. Commodore Carter will compile the information and present it at the March board meeting.

**Long Range Planning Committee:** Steve Mardis reported that the Long Range Planning Committee met and reviewed the goals that had previously been made and updated those goals. The new goals include increasing membership to 150 members and having 100% occupancy of the slips.

**Racing Activities:** Ken Rix reported that the Racing Committee met with all interested racers at Gander Mountain on Sunday, Feb. 10th and reviewed the 2008 racing dates and times. Input from those attending was requested and after discussion the schedule was agreed upon. In addition, the format for determining the club championship was discussed and finalized.

## Old Business:

Ken Rix reported that he had looked into bringing a guest speaker to Wichita in conjunction with the Ninescah Yacht Club. After researching this possibility, he recommended that this plan be tabled for future consideration. A motion to table this plan was made, seconded and approved.

Commodore Carter reported on the plan to identify all owners of boats and trailers in dry storage, according to the WVSC rules. He recommended tags identifying owners be attached to each trailer. It was moved, seconded and approved. After additional discussion,

the motion was amended as follows: the Treasurer will provide a list of who is to be in each space and also a list of owners who are current on their dry storage fees, to the chairperson of Dry Storage. The chairperson will then be responsible to tag each trailer with a removable plastic tag identifying ownership. A motion to approve this plan was moved, seconded and approved. Commodore Carter will provide information on this plan in the Windword.

## New Business:

A motion to reinstate two members who had forfeited their membership by not paying their annual dues in a timely fashion was made. Both members have now paid all applicable fees. The motion was approved as presented.

**Member concerns:** Clark Chambers reported that recently he was at the lake and the security system for the Activity Center was not set. Commodore Carter requested Clark, as the chair for the Activity Center, place a reminder and instructions for activating the system on a card by the front door.

**Closing Remarks:** Commodore Carter will advise the membership, through the Windword, of a launch date scheduled for April 12th, with a rain date on April 19th. Any member wishing to launch their boat on this date can do so knowing that there will be other members available to assist them if necessary. Lunch will be provided.

Commodore Carter reported the club's web site needs to be updated and anyone having information to be added to the site is to contact Bruce Ward as soon as possible.

The March board meeting will be March 20th at 7 PM at the office of Steve Mardis.

**Adjournment:** A motion to adjourn was moved and seconded and the meeting was adjourned at 9:05 PM.
