



From the Chartroom

Ok ladies, what would it be like to sail around the world? By yourself??

"And why not," you say? Well, you've got a point! Because the precedent was set on June 8, 1978 when Naomi James, DBE (b. 1949) became the first woman to sail around the world via Cape Horn! (All right you purists, you're right – James was not



exactly the first woman to sail around the world; Krystyna Chojnowska-Liskiewicz of Poland actually beat her by two months, completing her voyage on April 21, 1978. But her trip was a leisurely one, taking 401-days compared to James's 272. Besides – this is the June newsletter, not April!)

Not only did James complete her solo journey via Cape Horn, she actually beat Sir Francis Chichester's solo round-theworld sailing record by two days. She downright waxed him!

The New Zealand-born James made her voyage aboard the 53 ft yacht "Express Crusader". During her voyage, she once lost her mast, capsized and had no radio for several weeks. Although she finished her voyage without a companion, she did not start it alone. A kitten named Boris accompanied her but went overboard during the voyage.

Naomi James was knighted in 1979 in recognition of her achievements, and henceforth became known officially as Dame Naomi James.



As strange as it may seem, James gave up sailing in 1982 after winning the two thousand mile Round Britain Race with her husband Rob, because she suffered badly from sea sickness during that voyage. (editorial note - I don't blame her; I've never again eaten at Taco John's after that bout with food poisoning back in 1986!) Sadly, the following year she lost her husband who fell overboard and drowned while sailing off Salcombe, Devon.

Naomi James moved to the United States in 1990 after remarrying.

So, from Naomi James to all you lady sailors – "You go, girl!"

RACING NEWS

Racing Cost Reductions...

In an effort to reduce expenses this year your Racing Committee decided to do away with bi-monthly trophies. Instead Gary Pierce has made Posting Boards for Keel Regattas, and Centerboard Regattas, to post regatta results throughout the season. The Club Championship, to be held Sept. 30, and Oct.1, will determine whose name will get engraved on the perpetual trophies. Another cost reduction is the \$2.00 per person suggested contribution to help cover the cost of the after-regatta gourmet meal.

Racing Instructions

Racing Instructions were drastically revised this year and are posted on the clubhouse bulletin board, and hopefully are in the new Roster. A listing of the Wind Dependent Portsmouth Numbers for those members interested in racing has been compiled & is also posted on the clubhouse bulletin board. Both the Racing Instructions & the Portsmouth listing are documents that require up dating, & revising. If you have information that is not shown, like sail numbers, let anyone on the Racing Committee know your thoughts. We may, or may not change anything, depending on the bribe.

There were quite a few enthusiasts attending the launch day, April 1 & 2. Hopefully they are ready for a successful season.

Results and Summaries

The first regatta, held on April 22 had a turnout of 5 boats in 10 to 13 mph winds. Mike Hand won with 2 firsts, & a second. Ed Webb was 2nd overall with a DNS, a 2nd, & a 1st. John Aschbrenner, & Mike Wasson tied for 3rd overall. Charles Squires also ran. Don Chism cooked dogs & bratwurst, a Janis Cooper salad, and brownies capped out a successful opening regatta.

The second regatta, on May 7, had a turnout of 4 centerboard (all Snipes), and 3 keel boats. The winds on the first race varied from 4 to 12 knots. Gary Pierce/Gene Nold won the first race, Ed Webb was 2nd, and Mike Wasson was third. In the centerboards James Rix finished 1st, Ken Rix 2nd,Mary Ann Rix 3rd, & Ernie Condon in his first race in his Snipe finished 4th.

After lunch Pierce/Nold, Ed Webb, & Mary Ann woosed out. (Did not compete), so Mike Wasson sailed with the remaining centerboard boats. It should be noted that this is the first time in WVSC history, I think, that there was a centerboard race but not a keel boat fleet racing. The winds had picked up to 9 to 14 knots & the water is still very cold in early May. Ken Rix came in 1st, James in 2nd, & Ernie in 3rd. Mike Wasson actually beat Ernie by 22 seconds on corrected time but being the only keel boat it was not scored. It takes 3 centerboard or keel boats to constitute an official race.

Lots of talk, sloppy joes, pasta salad, brownies, Mike Wasson's birthday cake & ice cream concluded the fun day.

Remember the next regattas on May 27, June 4, & June 17. Expect to see you all participating.

Board Meeting Minutes

WALNUT VALLEY SAILING CLUB BOARD OF GOVERNOR MEETING Minutes Subject to Correction

THURSDAY, MAY 11, 2006

CALL TO ORDER: Commodore Pat Boyarski called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm at the office of Steve Mardis, 9415 E. Harry, Suite 603, Wichita, Kansas. Board Members present were: Pat Boyarski, David Reynolds, Kathy Malcom, Steve Mardis, Gene Plehal, Ron White and John McCabe.

APPROVAL OF APRIL MINUTES: The minutes of the April 13, 2006 meeting were reviewed and submitted for discussion. Discussion was had and Malcom noted that the minutes should be amended to reflect that the member installing the new boat lift had paid the damage deposit. Plehal noted that the second item under the New Business section should be amended to read, "The Dry Storage Committee plans to repair a non-operative pole light at the east end of the Dry Storage facility". Gene noted the repair had been made. The corrections were acknowledged by the secretary. Reynolds made a motion to approve the April 13, 2006 minutes, seconded by John McCabe. *Motion carried*.

MARCH TREASURER'S REPORT: Malcom reported that there were108 paid regular members and 1 regular member is currently unpaid.

Treasurer Malcom reported that two new members have joined the club: Robert and Keri August and JaNine DeLaughder. The Augusts were previously approved by a telephone vote conducted by Boyarski. De Laughder was approved by voice vote.

Malcom reported that the cash balance at April 30, 2006 was \$36,326.

Malcom presented the financial statements for the period November 1 2005 through April 30, 2006 to the board for review. Malcom also presented to the board the monthly check register for April 2006. Ron White made the motion to approve the Treasurer's Report, John McCabe seconded. *Motion carried*.

OLD BUSINESS: All committee chairs have been filled except for Building & Grounds and Harbor Committee.

NEW BUSINESS: The Building and Grounds Committee liaison, Ron White, gave a briefing to the board. The new sign has been erected at the entrance. The committee presented an invoice to the board for the first mowing of the season. The committee's short-term plans include a replacement of the bottom plate on the grills and spraying of weeds in the storage area when deemed appropriate by vendor. Boyarski requested that the committee review the mowing service cost and frequency. The Power Boat Committee liaison, Gene Plehal, reported for Paul Malcolm, committee chairman, that the committee boat cover and upholstery needed repaired. They will obtain an estimate of cost to repair. The committee believes a log book should be maintained for all boat usage, including: date boat is used, operator, and fluids added.



The following committees were selected to report at the next board meeting: Building & Grounds, Harbor, Security and Dry Storage.

The following committees were selected to report at the July board meeting: Public Relations.

Boyarski requested that the Finance Committee present the 2007 budget at the September board meeting.

MEMBERS CONCERNS: Discussion was had relative to dock security. Members should be reminded to make sure the gate to the club house is locked and secure upon leaving the facility. It was also discussed that boats and trailers in dry storage should be properly secured and trailers should be marked with the owner's name.

The attachment points for the port-a-potties and the dry storage fence need to be inspected for damage. Also, the picnic tables are in need of repair. Gene Nold, Government Relations Committee Chairman, will contact the Park Service regarding exchanging the tables. John McCabe agreed to coordinate the table exchange.

The Park Service has requested the use of the activity center for an employee retreat during the middle of October 2006. The board agreed to allow the use of the activity center, without charge, in support of the Park Service employees. The Park Service will be allowed to use the activity center with the understanding that the water may have been turned off and sewer winterized for the season. Gene Nold will assure that this is understood by the Park Service.

The next Board Meeting will be held at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 14, 2006 at Steve Mardis' office, 9415 E. Harry Suite # 603. *There being no further business to discuss, a motion to adjourn was made by Plehal, seconded by McCabe, and motion was unanimously carried.*
