

- -January Meeting Minutes: typo on the date of the meeting, corrected to read January 12, 2012. January Meeting Minutes approved as corrected.

New Business:

Treasurer's Report: Paul Schye presented the Treasurer's Report. The Projected Revenues and Expenses were also reviewed against the 2012 Budget. The Treasurer's report was accepted.

Committee Reports: Finance Committee: Paul Schye reports the Finance Committee is working on the yearly insurance renewals, taxes, and membership report to Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks, and Tourism.

Racing Committee: Gary Mackey reports the annual Club Racing meeting will be February 12 at 3:00 p.m. at the Andover Pizza Hut.

Power Boat Committee: No report.

Building and Grounds Committee: Gary Pierce reports that John McCabe is the Building and Grounds Committee Chairman. David Bonifield reports that a bid was received for repairs to the fence around the Dry Storage area. The Club will investigate doing the work with Club labor.

Security Committee: No report. **Calling Committee:** No report.

Long Range Planning Committee: Ernie Condon reports that the members of the Long Range Planning Committee are Ernie Condon-Chairman, Greg Rinker, David Reynolds, Rob Brown, and Bill Fonger. Commodore Bonifield requested that the Long Range Planning Committee review the long term financial situation of the club, especially focusing on long term maintenance expenses. At the next board meeting, Ernie will provide the names of the committee members that will serve 1, 2, and 3 year terms.

Membership Committee: A new member application was received from Art Gentry. Motion made to approve the new membership application, pending receipt of dues. Motion passed. The Walnut Valley Sailing Club welcomes Art Gentry.

Minutes Subject to Correction

Ed Webb reports that the Membership/Public Relation Committee met on January 26, 2012. The Committee set a goal of 10 new members. The Club will have a booth at the Kansas Sport Boat and Travel show February 16-19 at the Kansas Pavilions (next to the old Kansas Coliseum) to promote the Club.

Mark Janzen, Membership/Public Relations Committee Chairman, presented a web based club management and online directory program. The program is hosted by Hubris Communication. Mark demonstrated the program which is currently in use by another local group. Some features include the availability for members to update their own information, on-line event management capability, and automatic email reminders. An iPhone app (and possibly a Droid app) for the membership directory could also be available. The cost would be comparable with the Club's current Web host. Motion to pursue the web based club management and online directory program only after coordinating with Fred Harvey. Motion seconded. Motion passed.

Mark Janzen stated he is available to answer questions about the website.

Mark Janzen reports that the Membership Committee is also looking at a Come Sail With Us Day. The idea would be to invite the public to come to the lake for a sail. Gene Nold stated that it might be possible to obtain Park passes for visitors. The Committee has also contacted Guy Bower, a Club member, and host of the radio program The Good Life about the possibility of doing the show at the lake.

The Board discussed the fact that the Club does not have a membership application process. It was requested that the Membership Committee propose a membership application process and present it to the Board at the March BOG meeting.

ADA Compliance Committee (Ad-Hoc): The Commodore reviewed the Club's ADA compliance plan with the Board. The Commodore proposed some revisions to the STEP boat usage policy. The proposed revisions be reviewed by the Board and discussed at the March meeting.

2012 SUMMER ADULT SAILING PROGRAM

Come Sail With Us

The Walnut Valley Sailing Club/STEP program is offering two sessions this summer.

We will teach you how to sail or improve your sailing abilities. We offer both Basic Keelboat and Basic Centerboard classes. Advanced classes in Centerboard and Keelboat may also be available.

So come sail with us this summer for a GREAT time on the water. Our adult fleet consists of: Catalina 14.2's, Sonar, Catalina 22 and Catalina 25's.

CLASS STRUCTURE

Age Prerequisites: Must be 18 years or older, have an interest in learning to sail or improve your sailing abilities and swim 25 yards with a lifejacket (PFD). (May be 15-17 years old if accompanied by an adult).

Equipment requirements: Participants are required to provide their own life jacket (PFD) US Coast Guard approved ageappropriate size, sunscreen, hat and water shoes.

COURSE CONTENT

Basic Centerboard Sailing Course

Covers beginning, intermediate and advanced sailing techniques in a center-board boat including: boat handling skills, boat related skills, basic rules of the road, safety, weather and nomenclature. Everything you need to know to sail your own boat safely and with confidence.

Basic Keelboat Sailing Course

The keelboat course leads you through the essential principles of safe, confident day sailing. It covers basic sailing concepts, boat handling, docking, anchoring, safety and emergencies, weather and basic navigation. The keelboat course requires a minimum of three students per boat both in Basic and Advanced Keelboat.

Prerequisite for Advanced Centerboard or Keelboat instruction

You must have the Basic Sailing Course or equivalent sailing experience

CLASS STRUCTURE

Course Content: Three levels of sailing instruction: beginners, intermediate and advanced sailing offered. Safety, weather, self-rescuing skills, basic rules of the road and nomenclature are also covered.

Harbor Committee: Doug Johnson reports that Earl McIntyre is the Harbor Committee Chairman. Gene Nold reported on the status of the dock maintenance bid from Gala Foam Inc. The Club will be receiving a bid for the material. We will need to find a contractor. Gene is working on obtaining a bid for the labor. There is an option to do some minor rework on the east slips rather than major rework. The ramp area repair could be done by purchasing the materials and using Club labor. The Dinghy Dock maintenance requires a contractor for some heavy lifting work. The Harbor Committee will work with Gene on this project.

Social Committee: The Commodore presented the proposed Social Calendar and it was approved by the Board. The Board of Governors will host the first social on April 21. The Club may hold a work day on April 21 and encourage everyone to stay for the social. As part of the Club's 75th anniversary celebration, the Commodore proposed a picture presentation of the Club's history.

Sailing Activities Committee: No report.

STEP Committee: Gary Pierce provided the annual STEP Report to the Board. The STEP program will have the class schedules available next month.

Activity Center Committee: The Committee is currently planning the work on the Activity Center for the ADA issues.
