

I was born in Czechoslovakia, and as I was keen on photography and traveling, I went to Kansas to study journalism to connect those two into a profession. In the meantime, I fell in love with exploring the US' beauty, and while I didn't have loads of resources to do it extensively, I used any chance I got.

After graduation, I started working as a photographer in Emporia, and I got invited to Wichita for a media convention_A perfect opportunity to see El Dorado Lake on the way. It rewarded me with the stunning sunset that I captured. The colorful skies that I witnessed in KS quickly found a place in my heart, just like the numerous great people I met there.

I no longer live in Kansas, as the US immigration didn't consider my case worthy of visa extension - sometimes, life goes differently than planned. I ended in Scotland, so that's the UK phone number. From time to time, the Atlantic also provides vivid sunsets, but I hope to re-visit KS and its community one day. If I do, I will get in touch; an afternoon on the lake sounds fantastic!


LOOK CLOSE! Recognize your boat out there in front Rob?

We are listing her for \$3,000 as is. You may see the boat in our dry storage area in site 111.




1988 Gloucester 23

MINUTES: A MOTION WAS MADE TO APPROVE THE PREVIOUS MONTH'S MEETING

MINUTES. MOTION WAS SECONDED AND APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY.
