From the Commodore:

No insider news here. Just a few facts most of us already knew. We sail boats better than we sing songs and we've got weeds six feet tall in dry storage. The good news, we can fix half of our problems, and the other half. We *flat* don't care. Thanks to Rick Brandorf, Paul Schye, Deann Gadalla, Ardie Condon,

Julie Barth and Janet Van Epps. Pretty *sharp* group of sailors and they put in a lot of time and work to make a nice evening - wonderful! Even if they can't sing.

Relative to the jungle in dry storage; we're on it, we can fix it, and we will, but it's going to take time, perseverance and patience. I'll pause here, count to ten, and give everyone a chance to look around and see who heard them blurt out **WT_!?** Myself included. I know, I'm thinking the same things you are. But as I explained to a few sailors Saturday night, we expected a battle with weeds this year, especially if it turned out to be a rainy season. That which it has. And not to be a shmuck, but it's all outlined in our March minutes. We anticipated much of this. It's not what any of us want, but we'll get there, in time. Jeff (owner of "the Grounds Guys") came to breakfast Wednesday morning

and he sat down and answered every question we could throw at him. Jeff told us more than once that if he weren't 100% certain we would get the results we wanted, he wouldn't have shown up for breakfast. Good point Jeff.

For the record: the Ground Guys have sprayed three times this season (once for free) and they will be back out in a week to cut the majority of the weeds down. Next year, we'll have a head start on our weed control program and get a timely start in February or March. We won't spray again until fall - October or November. During the the summer months we should be 95% weed free, or "the Ground Guys" will take care of it free of charge. It's in our contract.

This year we're working to sterilize the ground and eliminate several years worth of seed bank. It's easy to forget, but we are in the middle of a prairie and glyphosate only kills what's actively growing above ground, we're working on that... *and* the seed bank in the ground. (multiple chemical combinations - all state regulated and audited - we're legal and not endangering our lake) As I said before, it will take time and persistence but *we will get there.*

We'll see all you fine sailors Saturday for the Photo Scavenger Hunt, the Pig Roast and Steel Band. It's all good.


Sailor Santa Kick'n out the bass with 45 Walnut Valley Sailing Club Sailors at the Christmas in July Social!







Blaine's Top 10 Reasons for Racing Sailboats at WVSC:

10. it's far less expensive than sailing in the America's Cup, and we don't have to quarantine in NZ for 14 days

9. Though the race can take hours, the entire course is within the Central Time Zone, so you don't have to reset your watches enroute to the finish

8. There is no overtime, extended time, or extra innings...it's over when the sun goes down

7. It takes incredible seamanship and skill to sail through obstacles (underwater trees) that are invisible to the crew



6. It's totally fair, as we sail different boats on different paths through different winds and different waves to the same finish line

5. The fishermen seldom troll through the starting line during the starting sequence, but when they do, they always follow proper maritime right of way rules by hailing "what are you guys doing?"

4. For our non-racers, the penalty for race infractions is 360 degree turns, which essentially means you end up in the same spot heading in the same direction...our crew completes those really fast—want to see it again?

3. Where else can you spend thousands of dollars for a race boat, hours and hours prepping you boat, and compete at a blistering 3-5 kts in a venue with no spectators or revenue -- ESPN, are you listening?

2. Regardless of how you place on the water, we all finish at the dock at the same time with a post race social and a cold beverage – literally a "draw"


