Is your outboard ready to tuck away for the winter months? A few things on Santa's Outboard Motor Maintenance list:

- if you haven't already run the engine out of gas put fuel stabilizer in any gas you plan on keeping over the winter
- install a new spark plug and set the gap a credit card is usually about the perfect gap, or rummage through your rusty old tool box and find your bent feeler gauge
- replace your inline fuel filter
- change the lower case oil and engine oil 90 weight and 10W30 respectively *unless of course you have a 2 stroke engine
- take out the spark plug and spray a shot or two of fogger into the cylinder then gently pull the starter cord 4 or 5 times
- grease any zirks on the motor and lightly oil cables and linkage
- replace the impellor and yes you can do it and should every year
- be safe and build yourself a proper motor stand if you would like a copy of printed plans for the stand above - just ask - Or click on the link below:

Our racing crews sailed through another great summer

Following three years of drought, flood, and COVID, we experienced a relatively "normal" year. We competed in 22 races



this summer, fairly close to our four year average of 25. Twelve different skippers and crews took the start line this season. Our Club's participation in the racing program continues to grow each year, with just over 6 race crews (including race committee) participating per race. I'm hearing we may have a couple of additional boats racing with us next summer—that's always good news.

A number of items stood out this season, including the level of competition. Our crews squeezed every tenth of a knot out of their boat, changing leads and positions frequently. Finishes were tight, often within seconds of each other. One of our club's racing program strengths--as tight as the racing is out on the course, we always find a way to end up out the docks and have a great evening. It's a great opportunity to learn, both from other skippers and from your own mistakes.



Another hallmark of our Wednesday night races is our stunning Kansas sunsets. This season in particular, with the wild fires burning out west, we experienced some amazing evening skies. Our evening races provide some of the best sailing El Dorado Lake offers – even if you're not interested in racing, come on out on Wed nights, there's plenty of room to sail outside the race course, and enjoy an evening on the docks. We welcomed two new racers this season. with Chad and Susie

Johnson sailing a very nice Gloucester 22. Our "Ladies' Choice" crew of Deann Gadalla and Ardie

Condon sailed and competed out on the water. Stuart Funk continued to improve with his Hunter 23, completely re-fitted since rescued from an "axle-deep" position in the storage lot. Preston Brammer lent his C-22 to Dana Herring to finish out the season, and Dana made the most out that opportunity—competing directly with the C-22 fleet.

For this year's Club Championship, seven skippers and crews met the 50% participation requirement (including races and race committee). Once again, congratulations to our winners, Steve Kubin and Randy Malcom sailing their Capri 22. Steve and Randy won 12/15 races they sailed this season – well done! Preston Brammer and I sailed every race this season, and finished second. We got a good look at the stern of the Capri, we'll need to figure out how to sail faster! Stuart Funk continued to build on his improved racing from last season, sailing very consistently across the season to a solid 3rd place. Team Cape, sailing the big Hunter, finished fourth, getting the "big boat" trimmed and moving when the winds picked up. Not that there's any bragging rights in the Condon household, but Deann and Ardie barely edged Ernie on the Hobie 33 for 5th place, by a .05 average finish place. Dana Herring qualified on his Hunter 23, finishing 7th. Here's the order of finish for the skippers and boats who qualified:

For the Catalina 22 Fleet, we upheld the tradition of extremely close racing and finishes. Twelve of our races met the three boat requirement, and we ended up with four of our seven C-22s qualifying. Many thanks to Preston, as we barely eked out a first place, only .10 in average finish place ahead of Rob and Ginger Brown. Dana Herring barely qualified with 6 races in his borrowed C-22, finished third. Deann Gadalla and Ardie Condon finished fourth, continuing to improve throughout the summer. Congrats to all who sailed in our C-22 fleet. Here's our four C-22 qualifiers and order of finish:
