on the fan and fetch me a cold one out of the fridge? Maybe not but they could have with the Jackery 300 on board. Not only that you can: charge your phone, jump start the outboard, light the Kansas Coliseum, power the lunar rover and so much more.

This compact little powerhouse recharges quickly on AC power, DC power, solar, wind, nuclear reactor or methane gas produced by a goat. For some sailors mental telepathy works.

Ok, I got a bit carried away.

Watch this YouTube video if you think you might be interested in a portable power supply on your boat. It *will* run a small freezer-cooler indefinitely on solar power. No kidding.

Commodore's remarks: Met with Wednesday morning breakfast club, had some difficulty with entry gate keypad working properly. No notable additional news.

Approve January minutes. Motion by Stuart F. - Second by Paul S. - Motion approved by all. Membership concerns – No additional concerns aside from entry gate keypad.

New Business – New dock corners for slip B10 presented by Tedd Blankenship for board approval. Motion to approve addition of corners per WVSC guidelines. Motion by Paul S. – Second by Kevin W. Motion approved by all.

New dock corners for Preston Brammer's slip presented for board approval. Motion to approve Preston's slip for corners per WVSC guidelines. Motion by Paul S. – Second by Kevin W. Motion approved by all.

Committee Reports:

Powerboat – No new information. Cushions are still at upholstery shop.

Harbour – New ID plates for all slips are going to be made this season. They will be a contrasting blue and white color made from UV resistant plastic.

Activities center – No new information.

Membership – Membership application for Mark Dresselhaus [sp] presented to board for approval. Nomination for approval motion by Paul S. – Second by Kevin W. Motion approved by all.

New member Bill Allman [sp] is now on registry. Resigning this season are Zak Kissack, and Jeromy & Ashley Fisher.

STEP – Insuring the Catalina 14.2s, Whalers, and Sonar for this season. New outboard has been purchased for one of the Boston Whalers. 501c3 evaluation is in works for renewal consideration next season. Stuart has reached out to the Sea Scouts (division of Boyscouts of America) to engage our STEP program. Currently waiting on a reply. Stuart will also start training sometime this spring to acquire his instructor certifications through US Sailing. Start marketing campaigns for this season.

Archivist – Moving records to Troy Oberly's House this season.

Public Relations – Suggestion for monthly open houses for the general public and a few specialty events to engage public interest. Review ideas for Facebook page.

Finance – Paid Blaine for Racing awards, and Sales tax paid. Currently, the club has 67 Paid Regular Members.

Dry Storage – Still Dry for the most part. A little soggy from snow melting in some areas....This season we will be checking tiedown anchors for condition and marking all tiedown anchors with high visibility paint. locations. Reviewing dry storage ID markers for replacement if needed. Cleanup when weather permits.

Building and grounds – Grass service covered by Troy for this season, identifying mowing areas for firebreak.

Calling – No new information.

Racing – No formal meeting for this season aside from reviewing committee boat. Date to be determined.

Social – Still looking for possible volunteers to help this season. Ideas for a club Cookoff for a social.

Government relations – Review lake regulations with membership in regards to boat requirements and safety equipment on board. Corp of Engineers has inspected the club for environment regulations. Everything ok at this time.

Security – Kevin W. disassembled the keypad on the entry gate and repaired internal components. Entry gate is now working properly. Review pricing for new keypad locks for clubhouse and gate entry.
