
#### **Dear Members**


### JUST BEYOND B DOCKS

Organized boating began in Wichita in the 1890s on the Little Arkansas river near Murdock and Waco streets in Wichita Kansas. A boathouse was built and through 70

years of development became a very popular attraction for boat rentals, weekend attractions and even high diving exhibitions. The "Riverside Boathouse" was torn down in 1968. In 1992/93 a group of Wichita business men had a desire to put boating back on the Arkansas river, specifically sailboats.

The Arkansas River Foundation was formed and plans were developed to build a Boathouse on the Main Arkansas river.


There were 6 Sabot sailboats purchased. A warehouse that was on the north side of the Broadview Hotel was used to store the boats when not in use. There was an existing ramp that led to the river walkway and was used to launch the boats and teach basic sailing.




In 1992 the "Americas Cup" was held and Wichita native Bill Koch, won the Cup.

In 1993 the City held the "Annual St Patricks Day Parade" and Bill Koch brought a miniature testing model of the Americas cup Jayhawk and some of his crew to participate in the parade. While here, Koch announced that he would help with financing a complete remodeling of an existing building located on the river which became the Wichita Boathouse.

Soon after completion, the RiverKids program was born and began teaching sailing. To accomplish this, more than the 6



Sabots were needed. Also, Ten JY trainers were purchased along with support power boats. Sailing and the Wichita Boathouse flourished. After 5 years of



operation and a budget that was not sustainable, the Boathouse came very close to bankruptcy. The operation was turned over to the City of Wichita, Park Department and the sailing and all equipment was moved to Watson Park. The Park Department did not have the staff to continue the programs offered by the Boathouse therefore the



programs were shut down. All the boats and equipment used at the Boathouse sat doormat for 3 years.


### The first organized WVSC sailing program was held on El

Dorado Lake and started in 1986. The first classes held were for 4 weeks in July for youth ages 10 to 18 and adults 18 and up. Club member's boats were loaned for use in the program. This continued until 1995. \$7500 was approved at the 1996 WVSC Annual Meeting to pay for the cove excavation and concrete work. \$10,000 was approved at the 1997 WVSC Annual Meeting to complete the Long Range plan that called for the excavation of the cove, the construction of a concrete pad, the purchase of floatable docks, rubber pads to cover the concrete pad and small boat storage racks. In 1998 the cove excavation, concrete pad, the rubber pads and the storage racks were constructed. 1999 saw the completion of this project and also a recommendation by the Long Range Planning Committee to purchase a fleet of small centerboard boats for use by the Youth Sailing Program. Three Prams and two Optimist sailboats were purchased.

In 2000, the first year of operation of the new facilities, four volunteer instructors taught 16 youth and 5 adults using borrowed club members boats. Construction of a movable storage facility for the program was also approved.

In the five years of operation of the Wichita Boathouse, there were a number of WVSC club members that were involved in the funding and operation offered at the Wichita Boathouse. They were concerned about the non-use of the boats and equipment sitting at the Watson Park facility. In 2001 the WVSC Board decided to approach the City of Wichita Park Department to allow WVSC to take over the defunct RiverKids program and all associated equipment. In exchange WVSC would teach and certify the instructors that were employed by the City to work at the Watson Park facility. The City Park Director agreed and all the equipment used to teach sailing in the Boathouse

operation were transferred to the WVSC Youth Program. This gave the WVSC Youth Sailing Program a



very good inventory of boats which added 5 Sabots, 6 JY Trainers, 3 Sunfish and a Boston Whaler support boat. A small boat storage building was financed by the sailing program and was built by volunteer labor from the club and the Hutchinson Correctional Facility. The building was completed and in place for the 2001 season. In 2001, the Youth and Adult Sailing Program was established.

# The Eastport Pram

The Eastport Pram's many joys are multiplied when you add the sailing rig. Not a clumsy add-on, the large standing-lug sail and efficient rudder and daggerboard convert the pram into a proper sailboat with enough real



performance, upwind and down, to keep the most seasoned sailors interested. The 48-inch beam means that the likelihood of capsize is remote as long as the sheet is never tied down. This is the perfect craft in which to learn to sail, whether the crew is age 8 or 80.

Small tenders should be able to withstand heavy handling alongside the mothership or in the dinghy park. Planking is 6mm okoume throughout, with three 9mm frames and seats. There's a big, deep skeg for tracking under tow. In addition to multiple layers of fiberglass on the bottom panel, there are two cypress rubbing strips on the bottom to take the abrasion of dragging on a beach. For added safety, permanent flotation tanks are built in beneath the seats.

For all its virtues, perhaps the neatest thing about the Eastport Pram is the ease of construction...



Teak needs attention.

We need a party to look at this April through June. Hoping for an April 15<sup>th</sup> launch.

Discussion questioned whether additional committee would be a bylaws change?.

Preston suggests leaving the boats under Sail Training (as is). We can consider next year whether a new committee is required.

There are several repairs needed with the STEP boats.

We are good to go with Joe Goetz boat. It does need to be cleaned We could use this as a back up to the down time while getting the repairs completed for the Sonar. Sail Training group indicated they are not intending to leave the Goetz boat in the water beyond its training usage.

#### Expansions to "Owned Boat" Usage

Preston suggested that people might like to check these out and use them. They could even be used for the racing program. Absent STEP, we have an opportunity for a broader usage by members. The training boats would five Catalina 14.2's insured during training which are insured during training.

Can the board set a policy to determine how "our" boats will now be used?

How is usage of the committee boat controlled? Can any member use this? We have some other "value' based insurances on some boats (\$2600 deductible). It was restated that training students are considered to be members.

Insurance may lead us to see the need to sell these. Some kind of policy is going to be needed to cover member's usage. It was noted that we need to be pro-active. There is a good thought to a "community sailing fleet".

We might need a check out sheet, with some type of honor system. Chris Proudfoot example: "Think renting a Cessna at the aero club.".

BOG will need to look at Tax implications and look at insurance issues. We probably have more latitude than a strict 501.c3 organizations use of its boats. Perhaps we should pay taxes on certain boats, and then we have full use. This could drive some additional racing concepts.

Noted again that Bart had indicated that he will maintain the power boats. Was not planning on using prams. Lasers, 7 boats and Prams. (We have 6 of these).

#### Security

Discussion with Mark R: A Motorcycle group was seen riding down wood ramp to our dock gate. Throwing rocks in lagoon area to break the ice there. When BOG is there, please be watchful. We don't see rangers at night. Sheriffs will come if we call for assistance. 911 dispatch decides who will come.

#### New Business:

The group discussed the Laser boat that had been donated by Gene Nold (including trailer). He is requesting to get this back to gift to his daughter.




