Getting Ready To Launch Skipper? The not-so sexy list, but a few things worth checking:

- Are your Kansas Boating Registration stickers up to date and on your boat?
- Are your fire extinguishers easily accessible and do you and your crew know how to operate them? Are they up to date?
- Do you have a first aid kit? Visual and audible distress signals on board (a whistle)
- Where is your throw-able type IV PFD? Have you ever tried throwing it?
- Do you have properly fitting lifejackets or PFD's for everyone that boards your boat? Are they easily accessible or buried under the cooler and your old anchor?
- Do you know what IS or more importantly what IS NOT in your tool kit? Bananas Do you have extra ring-dings, clevis pins, sail tape, needle nose pliers, matching coasters, electrical tape, wire, crescent wrench's, screwdrivers... sun tan lotion?
- Do you have plenty of sail ties and extra line of various sizes on board?

The super-sexy list:

We hope this helps you prepare for the Big Bash Boat Splash, Season Opener on the 27th. We're not suggesting it meets everyone's needs, we're just hoping it helps you get on the water sooner, safer...and in super-sexy fashion.

- 1. Inspect trailer tie downs, trailer lights and winch
- 2. Check tire pressures on both trailer and tow vehicle
- 3. Grease bearings, ensure lug nuts are tight and not rusted, check tire tread and pressure
- 4. Check parking brake. Ensure trailer hitch and safety chains are secure
- 5. Check dock lines, bow line, throw lines, spring lines, check horn cleats in assigned slip
- 6. Check anchor and tackle
- 7. Inspect navigation lights
- 8. Ensure registration numbers are properly displayed and current Kansas Boater Registration documentation is onboard
- 9. Check hull for damage, soft spots or blistering
- 10. Test bilge pump
- 11. Try on your Speed-O
- 12. Check gauges if you have them
- 13. Test marine radio
- 14. Check magnetic compass, charts and navigation tools.
- 15. Check engine oil for level and color. Do you have FRESH gas on hand mixed properly?.
- 16. Do you know when your impeller was last changed?
- 17. Check fuel system for leaks (visual and "sniff test"). Check fuel levels and remember to have enough for: 1/3 out, 1/3 return, 1/3 spare.
- 18. Ensure battery connections are clean and tight
- 19. Replace anodes if over half gone
- 20. Check propeller for damage, shaft for debris, prop nut torque

- 21. Do you have someone helping you raise your mast, do you know how to safely use the mast hoist? Ask around. Folks are happy to help.
- 22. Ensure scuppers are clear, bilge clean and all drain plugs are installed
- 23. Check transom for cracks
- 24. Inspect trailer bunks for damaged boards or torn carpet
- 25. Do you know your assigned slip number are you prepared to tie off your boat securely?
- 26. Do you have a set of fenders ready with fresh clean lines. (not frayed, sun damaged, knotted)
- 27. Did you salute the Harbor Master and Commodore properly as you greeted them today?

Well done. We'll see you on the 27th, if not before.

Commodore's Remarks

Preparing to open for the season. Saturday April 27 to be our "Launch Day". There is a also race meeting scheduled for that morning.

It was suggested that we have a "Meet the Board" time at 4:30 pm that day. We will need to combine this with some building cleaning. Noted that the Breakfast group will start meeting on Wednesdays, as soon as the water is turned on. Formal cleaning can start at that point

We will have 1 more BOG meeting before this date. We will set up a cleaning party at that next meeting.

January 11 BOG Meeting Minutes Approval

The minutes of the February 9 meeting were reviewed. Blaine Van Dam moved approval; Jim McEwen seconded. The minutes were approved.

Membership Concerns -

Troy has some input from several members.

Group to consider requiring a name to be placed on the inside of boat boxes installed to the docks. Commodore requested a better emphasis on assuring Members fees to be paid up to date prior to moving a boat into a slip on the Launh Day.

Spraying for weeds will commence on this Saturday, March 16th.

Stuart had a phone call about adult sailing class. The caller was having trouble accessing the web site. This writer was able to log into our website during this BOG meeting. **Action**: Doug to check with Charlie about the server access.

Hector Comacho's son is not yet listed in the membership list. Hector's son would like to sail without Hector's presence. (Writer also noticed that Stuart Funk is not listed in the membership list).

New Business -

Mike Reynolds was interested in bidding on the recovered boat box. Troy spoke to his belief that we should advertise this. It should be advertised to be in the Windword to allow others to bid, or

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know there is a bid that will be held. Julie Barth will send a text, in addition to the Windword "advertisement". There is a single box available.

It was noted that texting from Julie is "free". Troy will take pictures to show the box and its contents. Troy will follow bids and notify individual bidders of their status. Bids will be accepted through April 5th. No formal BOG action required.

A 1984 Hunter 25.5 boat was donated to the club. Before donation, the donor had been asking \$7,999 in his attempt to sell the boat. Preston Brammer indicated that book value was previously \$4K, is now up to \$12K. If the club is not going to use the boat, we ought to sell or auction it. There is some second party interest in purchasing the boat and using it for 1-on-1 sailing classes with high school age kids. There would be no charge to the students; a club member would always be aboard. Thus, there is interest in a purchase. Group thinking is that a boat sale could be transacted similar to the upcoming dock-box auction.

There was a question whether this would take the form of an "on-site" (in-person) auction, or would this occur with bids submitted through mail/email. The group noted that interested buyers will probably wish to see the boat. Current thinking that the sale should be an on-site activity, with some type of established minimum bid.

Advertising broadly would invite multiple visits to accommodate people randomly wanting to come to the club to see the boat. Suggesting that viewing could be April 20 and 27. It was proposed that we could then facilitate the auction on First Saturday of May (May 4th). Suggested that bids start at least at \$2,000. This moves the tax burden and insurance away from the club.

Julie Barth placed the above information in the form of a motion. Blaine Van Dam seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Boat Dock repair progress was discussed. This is awaiting our approval to proceed. Repair of the A dock end is urgent and is not really an option. Information is well written to define the task. Charlie and Kevin indicate they can get to B dock in late April to May. We will have to move boats in order to complete the repairs.

Julie Barth moved to proceed with repairs to both docks. Blaine Van Dam seconded. This motion passed unanimously.

There was a brief discussion about paying a single fee to get all of the old floats offsite to landfill rather than taking a few at a time.

No new information; our in	ternet acquisition activity is	sidelined until completion of dock repairs.

PowerboatsPreston BrammerBart PeaceThere is no real change. We are getting closer to launching boats. We have the new registration
sticker. There is a yearly question from insurance company: "Is there any change to the boats?"
Preston Brammer suggests taking the Sonar off of the insurance list. It needs a cover. We can
self insure any loss to the Sonar. Preston asked, Is there interest in selling the Sonar? Noted
that the "whalers" are not insured. But there is a new motor (about \$5K). Should we just insure
the two motors? Are we able to do that? Stuart Funk noted that boats need liability insurance

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because they are used for sail training. Preston will inquire further. Club liability would cover injury to a sail class participant. Our training boats are not individually insured. There is just liability insurance, not specifically for loss of the hulls/rigging/sails. The group noted that insuring additional "hardware" is not a slam dunk decision. As a reminder, the new motor was paid by residual funds from STEP program retirement. Insurance deductibles are set to some percentage of the claim value. Preston will do more checks and investigation..

The fuel connector has been fixed. (OMC connector)

Is there thought to attempting to sell the Laser's and Prams?

It was agreed to talk about this in the May meeting.

HarborJames McEwenCharlie VolkCharlie indicates compression damage repairs have been completed. Boards are re-installed.

Julie moved to accept Nick Comacho's application; Suart Funk seconded. The motion passed unanimously. As always, there remains a stipulation of all fee's paid.

It was noted that BOG needs to look at boats in slips to send notes to owners who may have seaworthiness issues. Our Bylaws "require a 30 day notice (bylaws) to owners with difficulties (with their boats). Other members should not need to be rescuing boats.

Reminders to be current in dues and fees prior to launching.
