In the event of an emergency this is the address to provide EMS, First Responders:



Tech Tip of the Month...



For a bucket load of clever ideas on the daily use of a clothes pin contact the first-mate or any respectable shipwright. For the rather nefarious applications, contact James - discreetly please.



Close a bag of chips, hold a match or stick of dynamite, organize papers, add rubber bands to increase - decrease clamping pressure, secure small lines for whipping, splicing, marking etc. Identify wires & hoses on an engine or motor, paint scraper, can opener, hold a tack or nail, reminder notes, hold repair manual open, cookbook, clip maps, blueprints, drawings to a board, wrap whipping line and needles around for sail repair... hang clothes out to dry, conceal a lethal weapon, repel from a helicopter.

Cheers to the Bowmen out there ready and willing to fly anything the Skipper calls for - even when it's that monster *asymmetrical jib*.




